Artistic Director Jo McDonald says that the reference to “Single” may be as simple as a solo dancer or musician or the more thought provoking issue of isolation and the need for connection in our increasingly fast and mass marketed society.

“Alongside our fabulous dancers we have live music from Emily and Thom Combe of The Finishing School as well as film from Moerae Productions” she said.

“Singles” follows on from the full-house success of Move Through Life’s previous shows “eMerge” and “123” in 2004 and 2005.

Artistic Director Jo McDonald is enthusiastic about the progress of the company, “Move Through Life shows that there’s no reason to stop dancing once you hit your twenties, we have a cast of dancers and choreographers all aged over 18 gracing the stage with their artistry and technical prowess”.

“There is so much enthusiasm and talent amongst adult dancers in Adelaide, but very few opportunities for them to continue to hone their skills and produce creative, challenging dance work unless they pursue the arduous path of the professional dancer. It’s fantastic to be able to provide an outlet for that creative and physical energy.”

“Singles” will be performed at 7.15pm on Thursday 13 to Saturday 15 July, and at 2.15pm on Saturday 15 July at the Star Theatre, 145 Sir Donald Bradman Drive, Hilton.
